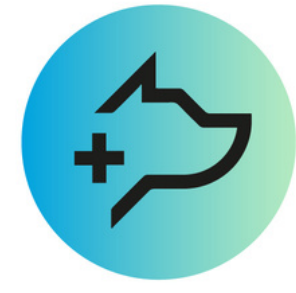

What does the role involve?

Community Fundraising Volunteers raise money and awareness for StreetVet. They may work alone, in teams or alongside the outreach volunteers, depending on their location. They act as a local ambassador for the charity and carry out an array of tasks including, but not limited to:

- Organising and attending fundraising events e.g. bake sale, coffee morning, quiz night etc
- Representing StreetVet at events such as cheque presentations and challenge events
- Speaking / presenting to local community groups to raise awareness
- Relationship building with supporters, companies, community groups & schools to encourage donations and on-going support
- Use networks and contacts to raise the profile of StreetVet
- Count and deposit funds received into StreetVet account following relevant process
- Become a Team Lead for the location, organise other volunteers and plan a calendar of events (optional)
- Act in compliance with the Fundraising Regulator's 'Code of Fundraising Practice'

Skills required

- Passionate about causes that support people experiencing homelessness
- Strong communication skills
- Confident public speaker
- Organised and proactive
- Compassionate and empathetic

Time commitment

- Flexible to suit volunteer availability
- Organised events and talks will have set dates and times which will be known in advance
- Long term commitment is preferred

What do StreetVet provide in return?

Training

Alongside the training provided to all StreetVet volunteers, Community Fundraisers will receive a thorough induction, training on the Fundraising Regulator's industry standards and access to fundraising resources. Volunteers wishing to speak to groups on behalf of StreetVet will also receive support with IT.

Uniform

Regular Community Fundraisers will be able to order a StreetVet uniform. This includes a t-shirt, hoodie and a choice of a beanie hat or a cap.
